

# **Subscriptions**

Subscriptions are handled through MailChimp, a group email tool. Subscribers receive an email when each issue is published and receive other *Panorama*-specific mailings throughout the year (CFPs, grant awards, fundraising, etc.)

### Readership (website use)

Overall, readership statistics reflect the period between January 4, 2022 (following the date of previous report) through January 4, 2023. Released on November 17, 2022, issue 8.2 debuted *Panorama*'s exciting redesign. Due to a glitch that the University of Minnesota Libraries did not detect and was not fixed until 12 days later, **Google Analytics was unable to track users and traffic between November 17 and November 27, 2022**. This was especially unfortunate given that the weeks following an issue launch tend to mark our peak readership. For instance, the analogous eleven-day period following the launches of issues 7.1 (4,698 sessions) and 7.2 (4,526 sessions) represented 5.35 percent and 5.15 percent of our overall sessions in 2021. Some but not all of our metrics could be recovered using data from another analytics dashboard, called Jetpack. Apparent decline or lack of major growth in some of *Panorama*'s user numbers for 2022 is probably due, in part, to this missing data.


### Peak Visitation <sup>6</sup>

Tuesdays (18.57%), followed by Wednesdays (16.68%), Mondays (15.83%), and Thursdays (15.59%). Busiest time of day is noon (Eastern), with the majority of our readership happening in the first part of the day (Eastern time). Peak time in general is between 8 a.m. and 1 p.m. Eastern.

We get the majority of our visitors through organic searches—someone Googles a topic or title and chooses us from a list of search results: 63.9% (66.3% in 2021). Other methods of acquisition include: direct searches, where someone types our name or address into a search field, 23.9% (22.9% in 2021); referral, where a user clicks on a direct link to our site from another place on the internet, like AHAA's website, 8.4% (6.6% in 2021); and social media, 3.8% (4.1% in 2021).

The percentage of social media acquisitions continues to be disappointing, particularly given a popular takeover of AHAA's social media accounts in November. The data loss between November 17 and November 27 corresponded with that takeover, so we do not know if or how many visitors it drove to our site.

Please note that the following charts do not reflect the total usership for the site, but only those users for whom age information was available in Google Analytics (29.67% for age; 32.13% for gender).




Our readership also remains predominantly female. Please note that male and female are the only gender statistics that Google collects.
